

HALL MOUNTAIN FY15 FOREST LEGACY PROJECT

The Nature Conservancy is working with nine landowners to develop and submit a FY15 Forest Legacy grant application for approximately 4,300 acres of private lands concentrated around Hall Mountain in Boundary County.

If the grant is successful, Idaho Department of Lands (IDL) will use Forest Legacy funding from the US Forest Service to purchase a conservation easement from the landowners.

IDL will be responsible for holding and monitoring the easement.

The goals of the conservation easement would be to maintain these lands as active working forests and farms while providing for important fish and wildlife habitat. These forests will continue to provide logs to mills and jobs to the local economy but will not be further subdivided or developed. Each individual landowner will work with IDL to determine what, if any, public access will be provided by the conservation easement.

The conservation easement will not affect the property taxes.

Timeline: The project is currently at the early stages of development. If successful, the project funding would be awarded in 2015 and the project would be completed in 2016.
